The Sunny Spot



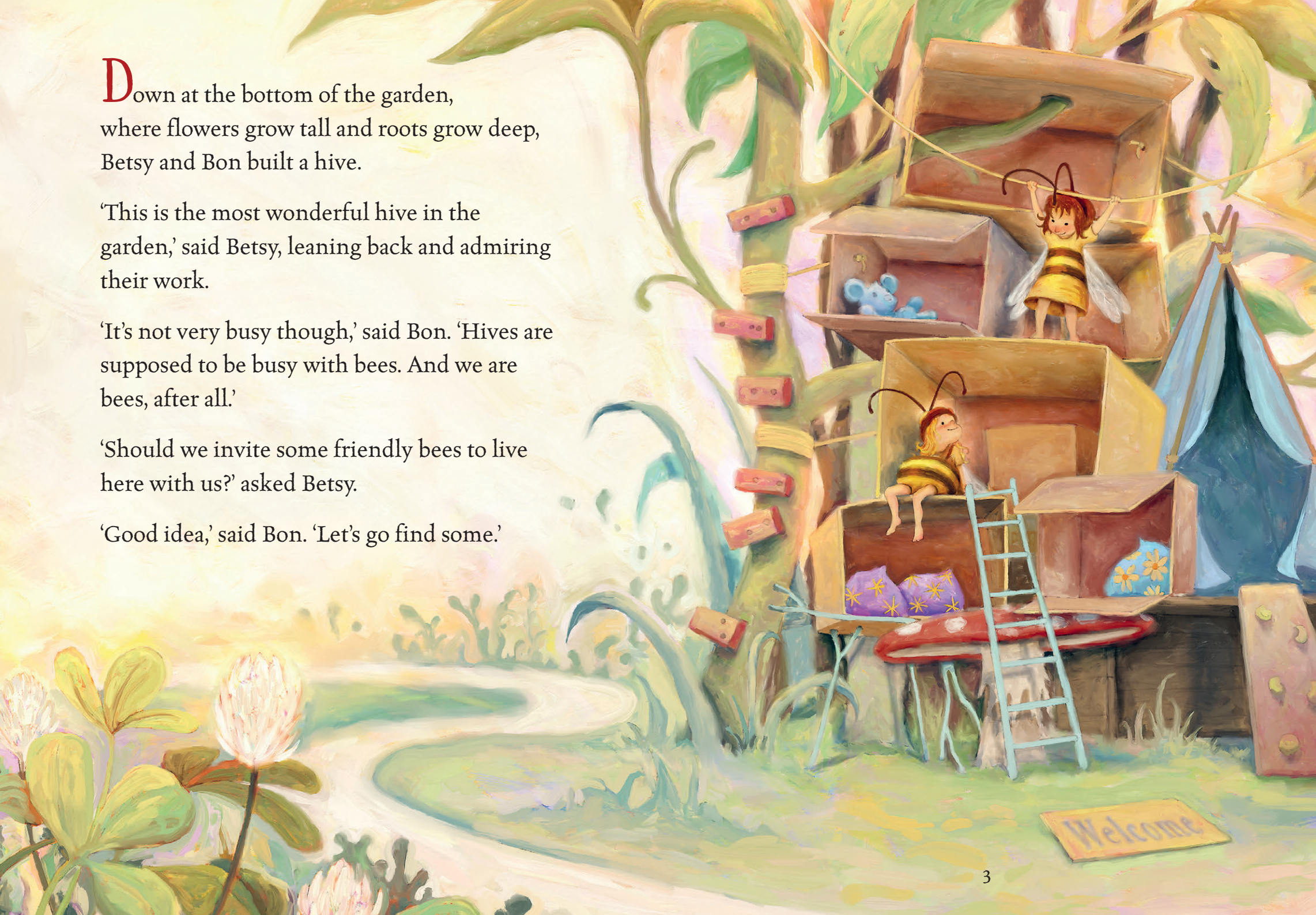
Down at the bottom of the garden,

bees, after all.'

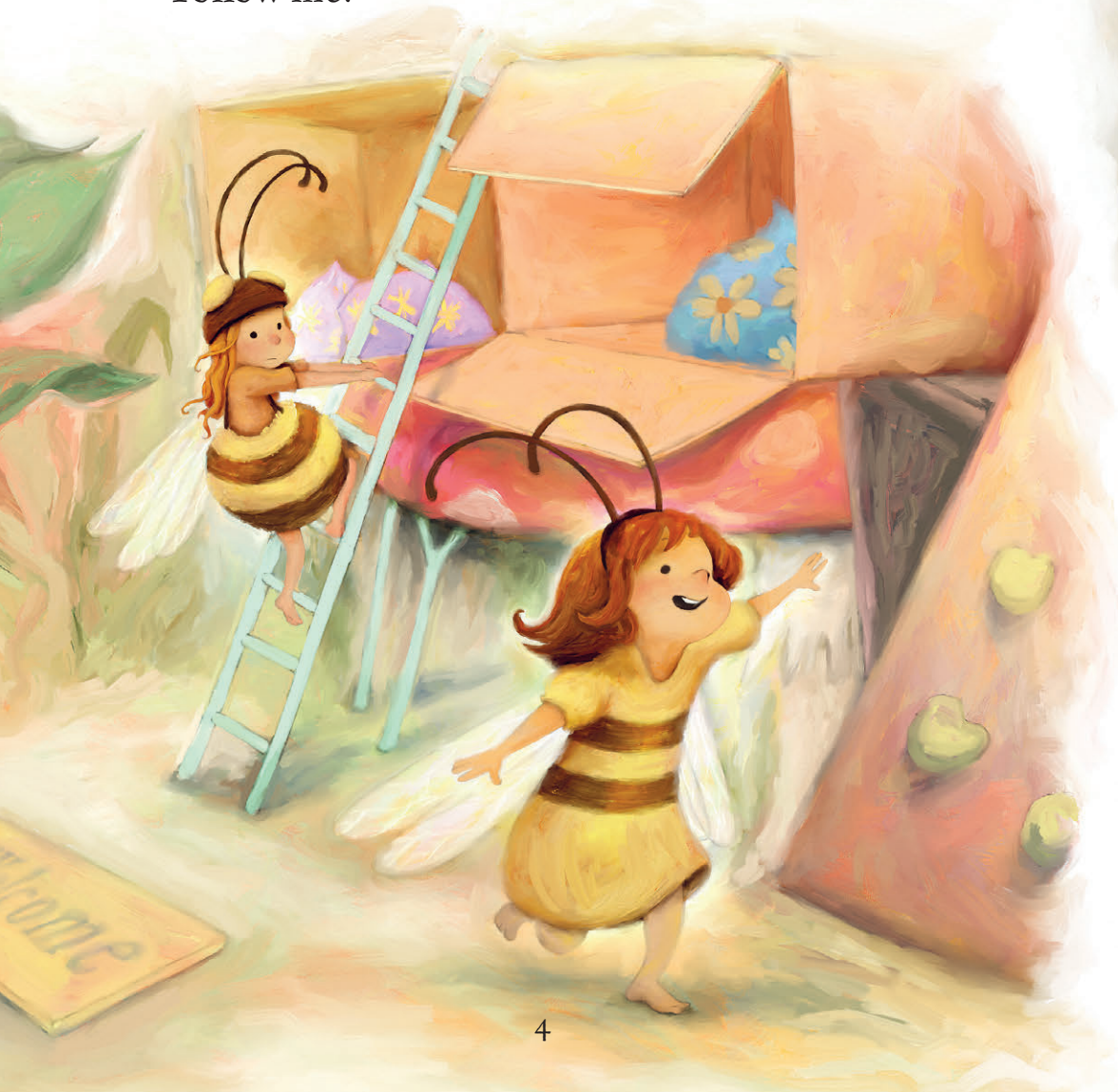
'Should we invite some friendly bees to live
